






# Path to Updating the Strategic Plan



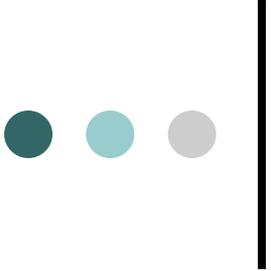


# First Responders

*Purpose: Ensure that First responders within the Commonwealth, both government and private, will be trained and equipped to respond to natural disasters and terrorist attacks using nationally accepted emergency management and response standards.*

## Objectives:

- Work to provide statewide protocols for the credentialing and background checks for all first responders.
- Work to ensure common basic competencies for all first responders in all disciplines.
- Ensure appropriate resources and effort remains devoted to the Commonwealth's information interoperability program.
- Work to ensure participation by the first responder community in Regional Commonwealth Preparedness Advisory Committees.

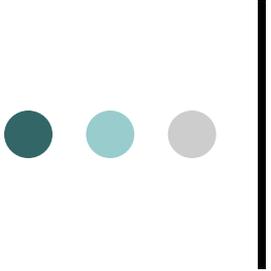


# Business & Industry

*Purpose: Ensure that business within the Commonwealth have the requisite information, training, tools and established public-private partnerships to prepare for, mitigate respond to and recover from the effects of man caused or natural disasters.*

## Objectives:

- Work to facilitate private sector participation in the information and intelligence sharing process.
- Work with the private sector to identify and remediate outstanding liability issues.
- Work to provide credentialing of essential private sector personnel to permit them expedited reentry into areas affected by disasters.

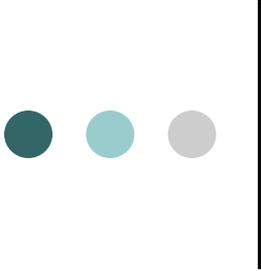


# Critical Infrastructure

*Purpose: Ensure a safer, more secure and more resilient Virginia by enhancing the protection of the Commonwealth's Critical Infrastructure and Key Resources (CI/KR) to prevent, deter, neutralize or mitigate the effects of natural or man caused events in conformance with the National Infrastructure Protection Plan (NIPP).*

## Objectives:

- Put coordinated, risk-based CI/KR plans and programs in place to address known and potential threats and hazards.
- Put processes in place to identify and address dependencies and interdependencies to allow for timely and effective implementation of protective actions.
- Ensure access to robust information-sharing networks, including establishment of a statewide common policy for handling critical infrastructure information, sensitive security information, law enforcement sensitive information, federally classified information and the associated necessary personnel surety programs.
  - Identify and advocate for appropriate resource investment in personnel and equipment to accomplish CI/KR program goals.

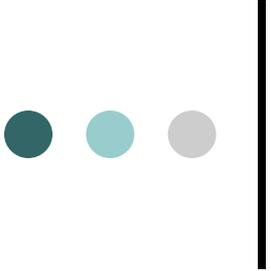


# Health & Medical

*Purpose: Conduct activities so that the Commonwealth will be enabled to prevent, detect, report, investigate, control and recover from natural or man caused infectious disease outbreaks.*

## Objectives:

- Identify and advocate for appropriate resources for epidemiologic surveillance and investigation to ensure capability to detect and respond to disease risks.
- Ensure that the Commonwealth continues to serve as a resource for its citizens by monitoring and distributing current information about diseases that may threaten their health on all appropriate venues including public web sites.
- Ensure that the Commonwealth provides appropriate resources and plans for: Mass therapeutics distribution, Strategic National Stockpile use and maintenance, medical mass casualty surge capability, and health care self-sufficiency for a minimum of 72 hours.




# Outreach


*Purpose: Conduct activities so that citizens of the Commonwealth are informed of preparedness efforts; are provided the opportunity to provide input to first responders, private leaders, and public policy decision makers; and receive information on self preparedness.*

## Objectives:

- Develop strategies for presenting successful Secure Commonwealth preparedness activities (such as Best Practices, Lessons Learned, and opportunities for education and training) to first responders, localities, emergency response non-profit organizations, businesses, media outlets and citizens of the Commonwealth.
- Identify opportunities for developing regional forums for citizens and local industry members to provide input to the Secure Commonwealth Panel.
- Ensure that people with disabilities, the elderly, and diverse and underserved populations are integrated into the emergency planning process.
- Facilitate positive working relationships with localities to ensure that a coordinated preparedness process is implemented across the Commonwealth.


